

DEFINITIONS - TYPES OF WASTE INCLUDED ON THE SOLID WASTE GENERATION REPORT

Commercial Waste – MSW hauled by AW under a franchise agreement from businesses, multi-family complexes, and the AW maintenance facility to the SRDC for disposal. Source data is inbound tonnage at the SRDC scale.

Residential Waste – MSW hauled by AW under the franchise agreement from residential households to the SRDC for disposal. Source data is inbound tonnage at the SRDC scale.

Residential Clean Up - Material collected by AW during on call clean ups and hauled to the SRDC for disposal. Source data is route sheet notes.

Self-Haul Transfer Station- Material hauled by individuals and businesses to the SRDC for disposal. Source data is inbound MSW tonnage from Ox Mountain scale less all weighed inbound MSW tonnage at the SRDC scale. These tons are then allocated by jurisdiction based on the yards at the SRDC scale.

Self-Haul Ox Mountain - Material hauled by individuals and businesses to Ox Mountain Sanitary Landfill for disposal. **NO LONGER INCLUDED IN THE REPORT.**

JPA City Vehicles Transfer Station - MSW hauled by a Member Agency vehicle to the SRDC for disposal. Source data is inbound tonnage at the SRDC scale.

Roll-off Franchised Waste Transfer Station – MSW hauled by AW using industrial containers, such as a compactor or debris box, under the franchise agreement. This includes debris box services provided to member agency facilities. Material is delivered to the SRDC for disposal. Source data is inbound tonnage at the SRDC scale.

Roll-off Franchised Waste Ox Mountain – Medical Waste hauled by AW using industrial containers, such as compactor or debris box, under the franchise agreement. This material is not permitted at the SRDC and is delivered directly to Ox Mountain Sanitary Landfill for disposal. Source data is inbound weight tags at the Ox Mountain scale.

Roll-off Non-Franchised Waste Transfer Station – MSW hauled by AW using industrial containers, such as a compactor or debris box, that is not part of the franchise agreement but is delivered to the SRDC for disposal. Source data is inbound tonnage at the SRDC scale.

Roll-off Debris Box Ox Mountain – Debris boxes hauled by a debris box company (such as Timberline, Builders Debris, Arcadia Contractors, Peninsula Debris Box, Bayshore Disposal Debris Box, Forced Dump Debris Boxes, and Redwood Debris Box) to Ox Mountain Sanitary Landfill for disposal. NO LONGER INCLUDED IN THE REPORT.

Commercial (other) – Residual Waste generated from the SRDC MRF that is delivered to the SRDC Transfer Station for disposal. Street Sweeping Waste delivered to the SRDC for disposal. Source data is inbound tonnage at the SRDC scale.

Commercial Recycling – Cardboard, Mixed Paper, and Bottles & Cans collected by AW from commercial businesses and multi-family complexes for processing at the SRDC. Includes services provided using recycle tubs, carts, bins, debris boxes, compactors, or bales. Source data is inbound tonnage at the SRDC scale.

Commercial Organics – Compostable materials such as food scraps and food-soiled paper fiber, wood and other plant materials collected by AW as part of the franchised Commercial Organics Program and delivered to the SRDC for processing. Source data is inbound tonnage at the SRDC scale. This category and source data is new with the Q4 2007 report.

Commercial Other Diversion – Materials collected from commercial businesses, multi-family complexes, and member agency facilities that are diverted from landfill disposal, but not part of the contract defined recycle program or commercial organics program. A majority of this material is yard trimmings and C&D. Source data is inbound tonnage at the SRDC scale. This category and source data is new with the Q4 2007 report.

Residential Curbside Recycling – Cardboard, Mixed Paper, Newspaper and Bottles & Cans collected by AW from residents for processing at the SRDC. Source data is inbound tonnage at the SRDC scale. This source data is new with the Q4 2007 report.

Residential Curbside Plant Materials – Plant Material collected by AW from residents and delivered to the SRDC for processing. Source data is inbound tonnage at the SRDC scale.

Self-Haul Plant Material Transfer Station – Plant Material and Wood hauled by residents and businesses to the SRDC for processing. Source data is inbound Yard Waste tonnage from Newby Island scale plus outbound Yard Waste tonnage from the SRDC scale that was delivered to Bio Fuel Systems Inc. less all weighed inbound Yard Waste & Wood tonnage at the SRDC scale. These tons are then allocated by jurisdiction based on the yards at the SRDC scale.

Self-Haul Plant Material Ox Mountain – Plant Material and wood hauled by residents and businesses to Ox Mountain Sanitary Landfill and diverted from landfill disposal. Material is currently accepted at a 25% reduced rate. **NO LONGER INCLUDED IN THE REPORT.**

Transfer Station Diversion – Material diverted in the transfer station sorter, aggregate recycling and electronic waste recycling programs at the SRDC. Includes diverted material received from Member Agency vehicles and is directly allocated. Self-Haul Plant Material is not included. All other tonnage is allocated based on the monthly self-haul tonnage received from each jurisdiction.

Ox Mountain Diversion – Construction and demolition debris, auto shredder material, concrete and asphalt diverted from landfill disposal at Ox Mountain Sanitary Landfill. **NO LONGER INCLUDED IN THE REPORT.**

Unincorporated/West Bay Sanitary District Self Haul Tracking and Allocations- Within the unincorporated area, North Fair Oaks and West Bay Sanitary District self haul identification is handled by identification of city of origin for materials brought by to the Transfer Station by self haul. Occasionally, materials are allocated to adjacent jurisdictions based on customers' identification of origin.

COLLECTIONS AND OPERATIONS SUMMARY 2010 – Quarter 1

COLLECTIONS AGREEMENT:

RESIDENTIAL & COMMERCIAL FRANCHISED SERVICE

- During the quarter, commercial disposal tonnage declined 2.3% or 778 tons when compared to Q1 2009.
- During the quarter, commercial diversion tonnage declined 1.5% or 163 tons when compared to Q1 2009.
- During the quarter, residential disposal tonnage increased 2.4% or 448 tons when compared to Q1 2009.
- During the quarter, residential diversion tonnage increased 5.8% or 1186 tons when compared to Q1 2009.
- There were three incidents of private property damage during Q1 2010.
- Liquidated Damage incidents, year-to-date, have declined over 12% when compared to 2009.
- Average Hold Time for customer service calls was 18 seconds for Q1 2010.
